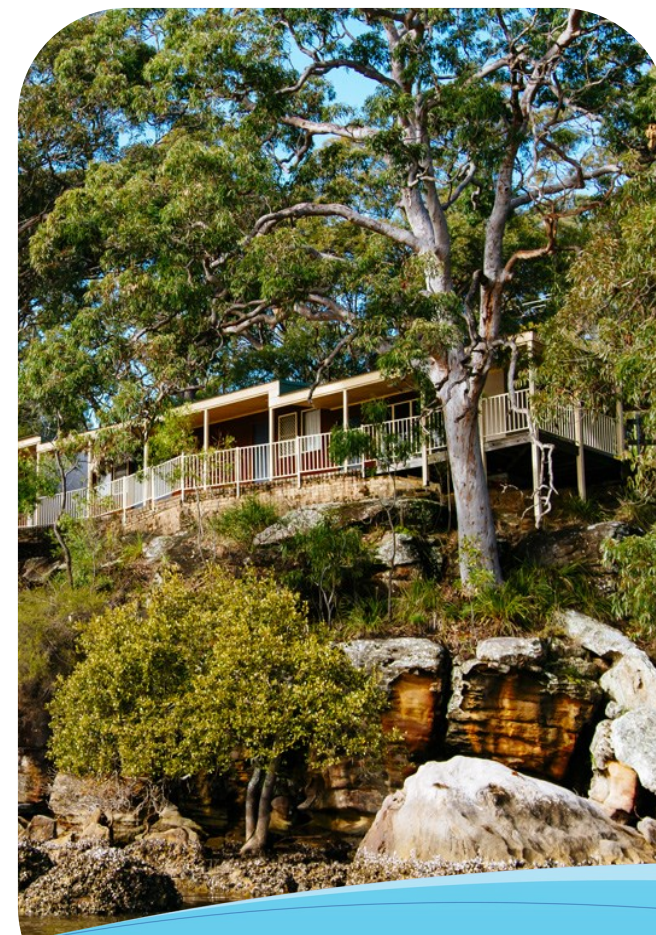

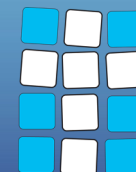

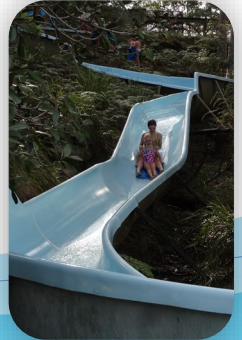

Walking in Truth & Love

The Three Letters of John were written by the Apostle John towards the end of the First century, to Christians who were being harassed by false teachers who were seeking to undermine God's revealed truth. John warns and encourages his readers to stick to God's truth and live it out in their every day lives.

In our own day, Biblical Christianity is under threat from within and from outside the Church. We can be confident in God as we learn from this part of His Word and as we persevere in our love for Him and our love for our Christian brothers and sisters, walking and working together in and for His truth and making it known to others.
