Luther 'fought the Devil with Ink' (1483-1546)

- 1483 Born in Eisleben
- 1501 Studied Law but ordained in Erfurt
- 1512 Appointed foundation Professor of Bible in Wittenberg (1512-1546)
- 1517 95 theses -- objected to indulgences as a 'human' doctrine.
- 1521 Subsequently excommunicated by Pope
- 1521 Condemned at Diet of Worms by Charles V
